

TPM HAS GONE GLOBAL!

What began in the smallest state of Brazil, is now reaching different states of the country and other nations of the world.

In the first semester of 2025, we hosted 46 events, impacting over 5,000 girls in 4 different nations (Brazil, Zambia, South Africa and Mozambique) with a holistic message of **life, dignity, and purpose, addressing body, soul, and spirit.**

Everywhere we go, new doors open. In each town we visit, more invitations follow- teachers, mayors, and churches alike recognize the value and necessity of the work.

Now, we are being called to **go further** - beyond borders, into places where this message is desperately needed.



MOZAMBIQUE, MAPUTO

Mozambique faces **severe period poverty**. Menstrual hygiene products are considered a luxury, and the topic remains taboo. With a **monthly income of \$11.84**, many girls are unable to afford even the most basic sanitary products, which typically cost **\$2 per pack** - and most require more than one per cycle.

In partnership with **Restaurando Vidas Church**, TPM will send a Brazilian team for a **9-day outreach** in local schools and churches. One of the highlights will be a **special session with mothers**, to equip them to talk about sexuality with their daughters in age-appropriate, value-centered ways. We believe **educating mothers transforms generations.**

Additionally, the church has a **local sewing project** that enables us to **manufacture reusable pads on-site**, reducing shipping costs and supporting the local economy.

BRAZIL, ISLAND OF MARAJÓ

Located in the Brazilian Amazon, Marajó suffers from **menstrual poverty** and **alarming rates of sexual exploitation**, especially among indigenous and riverside communities. The situation is exacerbated by the island's low Human Development Index and the vulnerability of its population, particularly young girls who are at risk of sexual trafficking.

In 2014, a parliamentary inquiry commission found that the sexual exploitation of children and adolescents on the island of Marajó is the worst in the country, especially the exploitation of indigenous children and children coming from riverside communities. Senator Damares Alves claimed, in 2022, that children in the region had their teeth pulled out to facilitate oral sex and ate soft foods to be subjected to anal sex.

In partnership with Verbo da Vida Church in Ananindeua, TPM will bring menstrual education, dignity kits, and values-based training to local girls - restoring their sense of worth, identity, and purpose. Pastor Tomás Agurto is working closely with community leaders to ensure impactful outreach.


